




Horseshoe Crab is estimated to be at least 300 million years old. Closely related to spiders and scorpions than crabs



Blue Herons- are waders, typically seen along coastlines, as expert fishers they snare their aquatic prey by walking slowly, or standing still for long periods of time



Blue Crab-one of the most important species harvested in the Bay, and has the highest value of any commercial fishery.



Diamondback Terrapin-the official state reptile of Maryland. Believed to be the only turtle that lives exclusively in brackish water.




Hard Shell Clam-live over 40 years. Enjoyed in a variety of culinary ways, Clam chowder may have been the 1st American soup.



Cownose ray- kite-shaped body has a wingspan of up to three feet and can weigh as much as 50 lbs.



American Eel- Looks like a snake, but if you look closely you will see that it has fins.



Canada Goose-The Canada goose has a brownish-gray back with tan or cream breast and underparts. I



White Perch-One of the most abundant fish in Bay and will spend their entire lives here. They are closely related to striped bass.



Mallard-one of the most abundant waterfowl in the world. Very closely related to black ducks.
